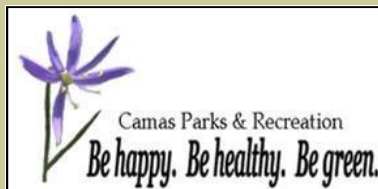

Fallen Leaf Lake Shelter Reservation Information

Fees:

\$350/day for Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays.

\$200/day Monday through Thursday.

\$500 refundable deposit

\$100 fee for serving alcohol

Non-profit groups renting on weekends will be charged the mid-week rates.

City of Camas residents will receive a 20% discount with proof of residency.

These fees help pay for maintenance and operation of the park.

Camas Parks and Recreation will process your deposit once the key has been returned to the office and the facility has been inspected. Please allow up to 30 days to receive your deposit by mail if paid by check or cash.

Cancellations must be made in writing two weeks in advance of the day of intended use. Failure to notify Camas Parks and Recreation in writing will result in a denial of a refund.

Available Dates:

Reservations can be made for events occurring between **Memorial Weekend and Sept. 30**. Reservations will be accepted a year out.

Park Hours:

Between 10am and Dusk.

Access to the park:

Keys to the gate are available at the Camas Community Center one business day prior to your event. There is a \$150 key call-back fee.

Users are responsible for unlocking and locking the gate and restrooms, and turning off all lights.

Fallen Leaf Lake Shelter Rules & Regulations

Subject to change at any time

- Private events only.
- Dogs are allowed on leashes.
- No amplified music. If you have portable music players, please make sure the noise is only audible within the boundaries of the area.
- A large open grass area is available. Bounce houses are not allowed on the property.
- Please leave the area clean for the next party and deposit your garbage into the dumpster. Failure to do so will result in the loss of your cleaning deposit.
- It is unlawful to possess or consume alcoholic beverages on public grounds without a permit. Underage consumption of alcohol is illegal.
- Water access limited to swimming and inflatable, non-motorized floating devices. No fishing allowed.

REQUIREMENTS FOR SERVING ALCOHOL

Proper licenses and permits are required to serve on public grounds. A \$100 fee payable to the City of Camas is required to have alcohol at your event.

Policies and procedures for serving alcohol:

- It is illegal to serve liquor to anyone who is under the age of 21.
- The sale of alcohol is not permitted.
- Alcohol service is limited to beer and wine only. **No glass bottles allowed.**
- Alcohol must be served in the area designated on your rental permit.
- A Washington State Liquor Control Board Permit is required for all events involving alcohol. The original copy of this permit must be posted in a conspicuous location near the serving area during the event. A copy of the permit must be submitted to the City of Camas a minimum of 30 days prior to the event.
- The renter is responsible for the conduct and behavior of drinking guests.
- It is recommended that alcohol stop being served a minimum of 1 hour prior to the designated end time of the event as specified on the rental permit.
- Serving alcohol without proper approval and permits, and/or in violation of any of the above policies and procedures may result in a police citation, immediate shut down of the event, forfeiture of your deposit, and/or additional fees.
- Certificate of insurance is required.
